AREA OF AUTHORITY FOR THE IASC: SEMINAR ON STUDENT VIEWS

Just where is the breaking point between the IASC and the student population of Illinois?

During the 1970-71 administration, a representative of the Illinois High School Association and the IASC Executive Board presented and approved a guideline which attempts to clarify the areas in which the IASC may act.

It states: "The IASC, whether it be the executive board or any organizing meeting, shall not have the authority to speak for the entire student body membership of the Illinois High School Association on any matters. The IASC furthermore, shall not be empowered to speak for the student councils of the IASC member schools. However, the IASC shall have the authority to take a stand on a public issue by stating the number of students, student councils, or student bodies for and against a particular resolution and to release such information to the public through regular channels."

This must be emphasized in regard to the resolutions that were drawn up at the Seminar on Student Views, held early last December. These will be sent to each school in the IHSA, and will be presented at the state convention in May. The outcome of that vote will be recorded and sent to the proper agencies, representing the students that participated in voting, NOT the IASC as a whole.

This guideline should be recognized for the importance it holds in displaying an accurate stand on the more critical issues today. These views can not, therefore, be contested as a generalization or a misrepresentation of Illinois' students in respect to the serious nature of the resolutions.

EDITOR'S MESSAGE

The presented format of the 1974 IASC Convention can not fully complement the activities that will be offered. Much time and hard work by the Host School has gone into assuring this convention to be the best ever. It is to every student's advantage to attend, to see, and to participate in the most active and essential student organization today.

The proposed IASC constitution will also be ratified during this time. Review the constitution featured in the last issue of The Reporter, and note the changes; changes, if accepted, that can alter present state policies completely.
