## THE NEW ROAD TO LEADERSHIP


Dear Advisors and Delegates of the 77<sup>th</sup> Annual IASC State Convention,

#### **IASC Summer Workshop Information**

The summer leadership workshop program involves intensive training in leadership skills, including identification and use of different leadership styles, organizing and facilitating meetings, working in groups, developing communication skills, practicing parliamentary procedure, planning projects, delegate, sportsmanship and many others. The workshop is organized so students work in large and small groups during the week. Each group operates as its own club with a variety of activities including problem solving, team building, collaborative learning and group dynamics. The workshop begins Monday, July 25 at 1:00pm, and will finish on Thursday, July 28 at 11:00am. Students will be chaperoned by experienced adult staff members. Delegates are responsible for their own transportation to and from the workshop. Students taking public transportation will need to notify the workshop director. This workshop is open to Student Council officers and members, National Honor Society members, class officers or representatives and other officers/members and leaders from any club, organization or athletics in your school. The workshop meets on the campus of Millikin University in Decatur. The registration deadline is June 22, 2011.

Cost is \$250.00 per delegate for IASC members registering before June 22, 2011.

Cost is \$275.00 per delegate for non-IASC members or registering after June 22, 2011.
